

Phila. Nov. 2nd 1891

My dear Aunt

Enclosed please find New York Draft for Two hundred and five and 25/100 Dollars being the balance of income due you to date. You will notice a falling off in this payment, which is due to the Schomacke Piano Co. not paying any dividend last July which would have been \$24 more if the usual dividend had been paid. The reason they did not pay is because they lost several thousand dollars

which they had on deposit
in the Keystone Bank
at the time they failed,
and caused so much trouble
here. Our City Treasurer lost
over a Million and a half
of the City's money through
the failure of this Bank
and got himself into Prison
for fifteen years, although
he does not seem to have
any of the lost money, it is
believed that the Bank
Officials robbed the Bank
and then fled to Brazil or
some other unknown Country,
I suppose you have seen
or heard from Mary since
she returned home, we have
had but one letter, announc-
ing her

safe arrival home, she looked
as if she had a 'new lease
of her life, when she left
here to go 'home, but look
very badly when she came.

I hope that you are quite
well again, Algemine was
sorry that she was hurried
away out of Oregon before
she had finished her visit
there, but it was the severity
of Marys case that hurried
her away, I think the west
agrees with her, and she
seemed ^{to} enjoy herself very much
whilst there, she has not been
so well here since her return
home. Katie Derbyshire
sent her picture here for
Carrie, and she is a beautiful
girl

twenty three years old
and her weight is 138 lbs
she is Dr Ephraim Debyshtores
daughter.
