

Oppose & put bad effect

8 o'clock A.M. Mar 17th 1855:

Sir

Pursuing in view the safety and welfare of the friendly Indians in the Oregon trail and Wappoolee Valley, as well as the peace and security of our own citizens - I have deemed it necessary to remove the Indians of that Valley to a tract of country on the head waters of the South fork of Yamhill River commonly known as the Grand Ronde, for a winter campment - The hostile attitude of a large portion of Indians congregated in the Oregon trail Valley - the excited state of feeling among our own citizens - rendering necessary to collect the friendly bands at the garrison. thereby preventing the prosecution of ~~any~~ work upon the reservation - on the usual means of procuring subsistence necessarily requiring the government to furnish nations ^{to them} friendly hostilities. The enormous expense charged in the Oregon trail Valley for suitable supplies and the expense attending the transport of the ~~the~~ army to the mining season has been among the reasons inducing this step. Instructions have been pushed, and am instructed to you come for my advice, directing him to ~~carry~~ carry into effect the contemplated removal and you will proceed without delay in the agency and aid Agot Ambrose in the performance of that duty. As far as I can aid in this matter ^{in a.m.} will follow immediately
