Dayton, Ill. February 22 - 1856.

You will take charge of the Emigrating Train of ~~California~~
~~and Molatto~~ Indians now on their way from Dayton
to the Grand Huron Encampment. and proceed with as
much dispatch as possible to that point. The days rations
have been ~~distributed to them~~ ^{issued} this morning - and should you
be detained on the road a longer period than that
you will purchase additional supplies to ~~subsist these Indians~~
from the farms along the route. ~~You will be able~~
~~to purchase forage~~ ^{also will be purchased} for the teams along the way.
The Train consists of six wagons & 2 carts with 24 yokes
of cattle, and about 80 horses belonging to the Indians.
