
Dear Mr. Finley:

On Tuesday, May 19, the Oregon State Planning Board will hold an all day meeting in the Green Room of the Portland Hotel. It is planned to give the entire afternoon to a conference with the chairmen of the divisions of the Advisory Research Council and such members of their committees as they would like to have present. This is an invitation to you as chairman of the committee on Wild Life to attend this meeting. Will you kindly extend this invitation to such members of your committee or subcommittees as you would like to have there to participate in the discussion?

The object of this meeting is to hear very brief reports of work under way and plans for the future, but particularly to discuss with the members of the Council the ways in which the Planning Board and the Council can most effectively promote the work of planning in the immediate future. I realize that you are very busy, but hope that you will find it possible to reserve this date and give us the benefit of your presence and your participation in this discussion.

Mr. Stanbery and Judge Boyington attended the planning conference at Richmond which was called by the National Resources Board and will make reports at the meeting in Portland. An important item of business to be discussed will be the advisability of holding a planning conference in the near future to which the entire personnel of the Research Council, its committees and subcommittees will be invited, together with members of the legislature and delegations from the county planning boards. Kindly come prepared to make suggestions, both regarding the future work of the Council and of the planning program in Oregon.
